Dorset House are hosting the Aurin Girls choir from Hungary who are currently touring the UK. On Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> June at 6.30pm they will be giving a free concert in the School Barn, with an open invitation for anyone to attend. "Recognised as one of Europe's leading youth choirs, the Aurin Girls' Choir has won 27 international first prizes, including the title of Olympic Champions in China, with recent victories in Montenegro (2024) and Budapest (2025). Their performances are celebrated for their extraordinary musicianship, vibrant energy, and beautiful and uplifting blend of sacred music, folk and contemporary Hungarian works, and lighter choral pieces. Founded in Kecskemét, the birthplace of composer and educator Zoltán Kodály, the choir is internationally admired for its distinctive Kodály-inspired musical training and has performed in renowned venues including Westminster Abbey, Christ Church Cathedral Oxford, and cathedrals across the UK and Europe."
